

## Actions Speak Louder Than Words

“And the LORD said unto Moses, See, I have made thee a god to Pharaoh: and Aaron thy brother shall be thy prophet. Thou shalt speak all that I command thee: and Aaron thy brother shall speak unto Pharaoh, that he send the children of Israel out of his land”, Exodus 7:1–2.

God, having finally overcome all of Moses’ objections, stated “I have made thee a god to Pharaoh...”. God had given Moses authorization to speak and act in God’s name. Thus, Moses now had more power than any of the court magicians.

Aaron was to be as a prophet beside Moses, just as God used Prophets to speak on His behalf.

The court magicians could duplicate some miracles Moses did, but when God sent the plagues, they lost the battle.

If you think you are called to be a leader, then ACT AND BEHAVE as a leader.

Moses and Aaron were called by God. His Authority backed them. God then required an action from them. He required them to front up before Pharaoh.

The title said, “Actions Speak Louder Than Words”. Had they fronted up before Pharaoh, and not spoken, then silence became an unprofitable action. Had they avoided Pharaoh, and spoken, there was no action, and the words became valueless.

Thus the main action here was COMMUNICATE but never DESIGNATE, go and do the job God has given you.

Perhaps one of the greatest Actions that has spoken so often in the world was in 1945, when the United Nation came into being.

To appease the anti-God Communist countries, the then United Nation leaders decided to omit mention of God from the UN charter.

The UN’s inability to settle problems in the world by a leadership action has drowned out any words for excuse.

Matthew – recording the Words of Jesus – states, “And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth. Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world”, Matthew 28:18–20.

This is where the title really becomes undeniable,

1. “All power is given unto me...” Power is –
  - a. the ability to do something or act in a particular way,
  - b. the capacity to influence other people or the course of events,
  - c. the authority given or delegated to a person or body.
  
2. “Go ye therefore...” Go is –
  - a. to enter a specified state or course of action,
  - b. to engage in a specified activity.
  
3. “Teaching them...” Opening the Gospel –
  - a. as guided by the Holy Spirit,
  - b. and by using personal experiences.
  
4. “...to observe...” To –
  - a. notice and understand,
  - b. comply with the instruction given.
  
5. “...even unto the end of the world”. You, dear readers, become an everlasting testimonial by your actions, for no words will ever undo your actions before others, but your actions will make an everlasting impression, and give strength to your words.
