

Approaching God's Throne

"Seeing then that we have a great high priest, that is passed into the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our profession.

For we have not an high priest which cannot be touched with the feeling of our infirmities; but was in all points tempted like as we are, yet without sin.

Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need". Hebrews 4:14-16.

Let us once again look at that third verse, "Let we therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need". Hebrews 4:16.

Jesus gave the location of where the New Kingdom would be established, it would be world-wide.

It is all there in Matthew chapter six.

Thy kingdom come, Jesus is encouraging to seek for the Kingdom, And become members.

Thy will be done in earth, Jesus is encouraging us to be obedient.

Give us this day our daily bread, Jesus is encouraging us to ask the King to meet our daily requirements.

And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors, God will expect us to follow His example, and forgive others. Matthew 6:10-12.
